

About Our 36th President FRED J. BELLISE




Fred J. Bellise was installed as the 36th President of the lodge on March 4, 2018 and a year later was reelected to a second term, by affirmation. Like many past presidents, Fred's journey is one of perseverance and determination.

Fred's journey begins after a decided to retire from a business career that spanned nearly four decades. He was initiated as Columbus Lodge member #4028 in 2008. Enjoying his interaction with fellow members and the evening card games, a year later he was encouraged to join the Council by two Past Presidents, Tony & Frank Musarra. He was elected Trustee in 2009.

After an election setback (2011), Fred rejoined the Council and was appointed Principle Trustee (2012). The following year Fred was elected Orator and served on the lodge's 50th Council. At the lodge's 50th Anniversary Gala, Fred saw history live as 17 past presidents attended the event.

While moving up the Chair Officer ranks Fred served as Co-Chairman on numerous committees including the on Feast & Festival, House Rules Committee, Lions Den Christmas Party, and Tenant & Building Committee. These committees gave Fred a breath of lodge and prepared him for the future challenges he would face as president.

Fred elevated to the V.P. level for the next four years. It was during this time where circumstances led to opportunities. During prolonged absences by the President, Fred was given the gavel and presided over meetings, made business decisions effecting the building, med and interacted with other lodges and the Grand lodge, and gained the support and trust of his membership.

As president, Fred brought back structure and a sense of leadership that, in some circles, was perceived as missing in recent years. His diplomatic skills improved a deteriorated relationship with the Grand Lodge. He negotiated the smooth transition of a new tenant, invested a million dollars into building improvements, and brought back some traditional fraternal activities while encouraging and acting upon new ideas. Two highly successful new programs was *Casino Night* and *An Evening with Mystic Paul Miller*. His most difficult decision was disbanding the Ladies Auxiliary due to insubordination. Fred's appointed a dynamic new member, Frank Franchi, as Membership Chairman would stifle declining membership rolls. And his paired Bill Murphy with Tony Ventiera as Feast & Festival Co-Chairman. The two men brought unparalleled financial success to the event. Since his term as president ended, Fred became a lifetime member in 2020 and continues to be a well respected resource at Council meetings.

Fred's early childhood was during World War II and his teenage years during the Korean War. In the last 1950s Fred was drafted and proudly served in the U.S. Army. Upon leaving with an honorable discharge, Fred's career would take different turns. He would eventually land in the circulation department at a major Long Island newspaper, *Newsday*, where he rose to an executor position.

While expanding the circulation of the New York Newsday, Fred had the opportunity to meet businessman Donald Trump. The two went toe to toe but in the end Fred got the rights to have Newsday in the lobby of Trump Towers. Fred's crowning achievement at Newsday was meeting his future spouse Sandra (Sandy) Fleischer. Fred and Sandy married on December 8, 1987 and currently live in Old Bethpage.

AROUND OSIA: A YEAR IN REVIEW

A Pandemic Effect from fiscal 2020-22

Since March, 2020, the pandemic came down hard on not-for-profit fraternal organizations. Donations had fallen. Membership rolls dropped. Since the Metropolitan area has the highest concentration of Italian-Americans in the country, NYS lodges got hit the hardest. From 2020 to early 2022 several lodges were forced to merge while others dissolved

The Donatello Lodge #2259 of Westbury became the last casualty in 2022. It was founded on July 22, 1984 by Charles Fuchillo, Carmine Monteforte, and Caroline Allocco. Their first president was Salvatore "Sal" A. Lanzilotta. Sal would go on to become NYS Grand Lodge President. Note-worthy Donatello Lodge past presidents included Annette Lankewish, Rae Lanzilotta, and Rocco Lanzilotta. The lodge was in its 37th year when dissolved.

Fortunately, Columbus Lodge leadership during 2020-2022, under President Caparco and his officers, kept membership engaged while Financial Secretary Bill Murphy was given credit for keeping the lodge fiscally afloat. Jimmy Raffa was installed as the 38th President of Columbus Lodge #2143 on March 6, 2022 and would guide the lodge out of the crisis and bring back traditional lodge activities.

The supporting cast that got the lodge through the heights of the pandemic returned with First-VP Frank Franchi, Second-VP Jamie SanFilippo, IPP Gary Caparco, and Orator Jim SanFilippo (who served as Principal Trustee).

Columbus Lodge Challenges

President Raffa stated his most pressing challenge was to "get the lodge back to the way it was." Filling the void left by Bill Murphy, who controlled building and fraternal financials and Chaired every major lodge event including the Feast & Festival and scholarship program, began with newly elected Financial Secretary Nick Bonsignor assuming the handling of lodge finances.

Raffa's next challenge would be to bring back establish traditional events. His "go to" guys were Bochynski, Bellise, Gatto, Ragno, and Ventiera. "They're past presidents, they've done it before and they know what needs to be done," said Raffa. In April, following a special Sunday morning massfor our departed members, the SanFilippo's held the lodge's traditional Palm Sunday breakfast.

In June, the lodge presented 15 grants to graduating students. After a nine year absence, Ed Bochynski returned as Chairman of the event. TOB Supervisor Joe Saladino schooled the students on the important contributions made by Columbus. "He (Bochynski) only had a few weeks to put this together and he did a great job," said Raffa.

The Summer picnic was run by two old pros who have done it before, Frank Franchi and Mike LiPetri. The weather was perfect, (sunny and low humidity), and the crowd came hungry and were well fed.

The September, *Italian Feast and Festival* was led by Chairman Tony Ventiera, who received beautiful weather and many new member volunteers. The Feast was a community building and financial success. Past President Frank Gatto was Grand Marshal.

In October the lodge honored Fred Bellise for his pre-pandemic tenure as president. The 140 in attendance was the third highest total in thirty-two years; Keith Wilson's testimonial during the lodge's fifth anniversary gala drew nearly 300 people and Ed Bochynski's testimonial drew 144; both were held in 2014. Tony Ragno hosted the event.

Following the successful Chris Molina's *Children Christmas Party*, the year was capped off with a fabulous sold out adult Christmas Party that included a champagne toast.

Without a doubt, Brother Murray Kaplan was the "secret sauce" in Raffa's rejuvenation of the lodge. Not only did Murray participate in every event mentioned but he also served as Membership Chairman, bringing in 36 new members. Many of these members were GEN X (born from 1965 to 1980). The shot in the arm of youth led to greater membership participation on committees and the success of all committees. "This lodge has a great group of guys that are always willing to help each other," said District II State Deputy Al DeBlasio.

President Jimmy Raffa completed his first term by exceeded his initial goals. He brought the lodge membership to a level of enthusiasm, engagement, and youth it hadn't seen in recent years.

It was a good comeback year for Columbus Lodge.

CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS CHANGED HISTORY 530 YEARS AGO

Cristoforo Colombo (better known as Christopher Columbus) was born the son of a wool merchant on October 31, 1451 in the Northern Italian town of Genoa. He was an explorer, navigator, colonizer, and citizen of the Republic of Genoa. He is popular because he was the explorer who tried to prove that the world was round by sailing across the seas and trying to reach other, unexplored regions on the globe, eventually making a mistake that would mark the beginning of a civilization and soon after, a new country.

Before setting sail 530 years ago, Columbus faced many obstacles but persevered. His request for funds was rejected by the King of Portugal and King of England before Ferdinand and Isabella, the King and Queen of Spain, granted him necessary funding to find a Western route to the Orient on August 3, 1492. Between 1492 and 1504, Columbus made four different transatlantic voyages. His voyages were not without struggles but he overcame storms, disease, and hostile native to become one of the greatest navigators and explorers of all time.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

Though he is credited with discovering the Americas, Christopher Columbus was not the first European to make a transatlantic voyage. Evidence exists that Viking Leif Eriksson may have made the journey from Europe to North America five centuries before Columbus's discovery of the continent however it was the "discovery" of the New World by Christopher Columbus that changed the history of the world.

Columbus was the first European to reach the New World in circumstances that allowed for major European colonization to begin. This eventually ended up allowing the United States to be created. The creation of the United States helped, among other things, to move much of the world towards democracy. It also led to the development of what is now a world superpower. He not only ultimately caused the founding of the United States, but also shaped Mexico, Canada, and many Caribbean and South American nations. His voyages led to others exploring and reshaped the world.

In addition, history was changed by the exchange of plants and animals between Europe and the Americas, commonly known as the Columbian Exchange. Tomatoes, Potatoes, and Corn previously unknown in Europe became an important part of the diet of people living there. Similarly, Cattle, Sheep, and Hogs were introduced into the Americas. So it was not the "discovery" that mattered as much as the colonization. Simply said, Columbus "discovery" of America changed history.

LATER YEARS

Columbus settled in *Valladolid*, a small town in central Spain, and it was said that he became a very religious man in his later years. He published books containing the fruits of his expeditions. The first was the Book of Privileges, an account of the benefits and rewards he was entitled to from his deal with the Spanish Crown. The second, the Book of the Prophecies, was more religious in nature, where he used several scriptures from the Bible to claim that his achievements were part of God's plan in the history of salvation.

On May 20, 1506, Columbus died of a heart attack due to arthritis (as claimed by researchers in 2003), in Valladolid, Spain. He was then buried in the La Cartuja monastery in Seville. At that time, he was known as one of the richest voyagers in Spain due to the massive amounts of gold that he was able to acquire.

Commission for Social Justice

WHAT IS THE COMMISSION FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE?

The Commission for Social Justice (CSJ) is the anti-defamation arm of the Order Sons and Daughters of Italy in America.

The CSJ was founded in 1979 to fight stereotyping of Italian Americans by the entertainment, advertising, and media industries. The CSJ also collaborates with other groups to ensure that people of all races, religions, and cultures are treated with dignity and respect.

WHAT IS THE NYS OSIA GRAND LODGE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE?

The Executive Committee sets guidelines and updates local lodges of current activities. This Committee is also in contact with the National CSJ and NYS Grand Lodge and works throughout the United States to assist in the National Office initiatives.

WHAT IS THE CSJ AND COLUMBUS LODGE'S HISTORICAL CONNECT-ION?

The CSJ was founded in 1979 by P. Vincent Landi, a founding member and the First President of Columbus Lodge. At that time Landi incorporate the National CSJ into a separate Section 501 (c) (3) charitable exempt-organization.

Since the early days of the CSJ during the 1980s, the Executive Committee has had representations from the Columbus Lodge. In addition to Landi, Joe Cangemi and Nick Viglietta, both past presidents of Columbus Lodge and Grand Lodge, also served on the CSJ Executive Committee. Columbus Lodge member Tony Romeo (whose wife Teri founded the Gift of Sight program) and past Presidents Dan Calontone, and Vincent DeRosa began serving in the late-1990s and early-2000s. And currently past Presidents Ed Bochynski and Keith Wilson are serving on the CSJ Executive Committee.

CAN ANYONE SERVE ON THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE?

Sitting on the Executive Committee is by invitation only via National CSJ President, NYS Grand Lodge President, or NYS CSJ Chairman. Any member of the Order can participate through their local lodge as a CSJ liaison.

WHAT WERE CSJ ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2022?

1) Protected the statues of Christopher Columbus against vandals and destructive revisionists in the cities of Philadelphia, PA and Rochester, NY. These statues symbolize Italian-American accomplishments.

2) Prevented NYS Governor Hochul from renaming the Columbus Day Parade to Indigenous People Day Parade.

3) Prevented the Superintendent in Beacon, NY from removing Columbus Day from the school calendar.

4) Achieved a Court Order preventing Philadelphia Mayor Jim Kenney from removing statue of Columbus, which was erected in 1876.

5) And recommend reading the book: "Christopher Columbus, The Hero" by Rafael; which defends Christopher Columbus against revisionists.

It was a historic week in Rome and within Vatican City in May as a delegation of Italian Americans leaders from COPOMIAO met with Government officials and Pope Francis to advance cultural and religious initiatives.

Judge Basil M. Russo, President of COPMIAO, also conducted a panel discussion with Italian Supreme Court justices, met with the Italian Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs, and sat down with the Vatican's Secretary of State to pinpoint issues of mutual concern.

The CSJ is consistently looking to form partnerships and alliances throughout our nation. We are working with these partners to promote public policy, advocacy initiatives, and the Italian languages in the United States.

It is all of us working together as one, projecting a positive image and educating our youth, that will allow the Italian American community to remain strong as we continue our battle to preserve Columbus Day and Columbus Statues that are symbols of our proud heritage.

Remembering SALVATORE "SAL" PETRONE

Sponsored by Peter Gisonda, Salvatore "Sal" Petrone was initiated into the lodge on April 27, 1995 and carried membership #3546. A year after he joined the lodge he was elected onto lodge Council as Master of Ceremony. Over the next ten years, Sal served on several committees, eventually becoming chairman of the Annual Picnic, Lions' Den Christmas Party, Day at the Races, and Committeeman Dance.

During this period, he formed a Columbus Lodge bowling team which competed in annual OSIA bowling tournaments. The team collected several first place trophies and plaques for the lodge. From 2000-2004 Sal was elected Trustee and appointed Principle Trustee in 2003 under President Tony Ragno. "I enjoyed working with him (Sal) in the lodge, said Ragno. "Always ready to give a helping hand."

In 2004, Sal made a successful leap to Second VP in a contested runoff election; it was the last contested election Sal would face during his remaining run up the Council ranks. Sal was also represented the lodge as delegate at the Grand Lodge convention. Unchallenged in his bid to become president and inheriting strong financial strength, on March 5, 2006, the 54 year old Sal Petrone was installed as the 29th President of Columbus Lodge.

Upon installation as president, Sal Petrone faced unforeseen personal setbacks that included the passing of his father and medical issues that included walking with the aid of a cane and going on disability at work. Although his physical setbacks may have contributed to a preserved low energy persona, Sal persevered. He brought a fair-minded approach to the office and performed many of his ceremonial duties throughout the year including the presentation of a scholarship to graduating high school student and future president Anthony Musarra.

In February 2007, (his final month in office), the Council approved plans to move forward with the renovation of the lodge's lobby entrance. Soon after completing his term as president, Sal's health returned and he distinguished career as Manager with the U.S. Postal Service ended upon his retirement. In 2008, Sal became a Lifetime member.

Sal Petrone remained active after his presidency and volunteered at the Annual Italian Feast & Festival. With the passing of Sal's wife Barbara, he decided to relocate to Ellenton, Florida in February, 2012. Sal returned to New York for his last public appearance at Columbus Lodge's 50th Anniversary Gala, held in January 2014. Sal Petrone died on January 17, 2022, he was 70 years old.
